THINK BEFORE YOU CLICK 'SEND'! – YOUR EMAIL MAY RESULT IN A BINDING LEASE

In a recent matter, the Court found that an email exchange between a tenant and a landlord's agent created a binding agreement for lease and licence. This was despite the fact that no formal lease or licence documents were signed by the parties and the parties were still continuing to negotiate the terms of the lease. If you negotiate lease agreements or any other agreements, you must be careful in communicating with the other party. If you intend that negotiations should not be binding then you should state this clearly at the beginning and throughout the negotiations process. Obtaining legal advice at the earliest stage in the negotiation process is always recommended.
